Senior Scholarship Competition: A single scholarship of \$500 may be awarded to a top senior prize winner in either the strings OR winds/percussion division. The student must meet the eligibility and repertoire requirements below.

Eligibility Requirements for the Instrumental Competition:

Intermediate division, all instruments: Grades 4 - 8

Senior division, STRINGS: Grades 9-12

Senior division, WINDS and PERCUSSION: Grades 9-12

Eligibility for the Senior Scholarship Competition:

Entrant must be a graduating High School Senior (or equivalent), planning to continue music instruction in college.

The student must study with a teacher who has been a CNYAMT member for the past three consecutive years. The teacher must currently be a member in good standing of CNYAMT and have paid their yearly dues by October 1, 2023.

Entry Fees for the Instrumental Competition (non-refundable): Please submit the application fee by check, made out to CNYAMT. Please check with your teacher to see if they are a current member of CNYAMT.

\$35.00 for students whose teachers are CNYAMT members. \$50.00 for students whose teachers are not members of CNYAMT.

Instrumental Competition Repertoire Requirements:

Intermediate: 6-10 minutes of music

One or two pieces (or movements from one piece) that demonstrate contrasting character.

Senior Division (all instruments) 10-15 minutes of music

Two different pieces or movements from pieces, that represent at least two different genres/time periods and demonstrate contrasting character.

Senior Scholarship Competition Repertoire Requirements:

Entrants are required to present a program of 15-20 minutes of music, including more than one piece, representing at least two stylistic periods.

Repertoire requirements for both competitions:

- * Student compositions will be allowed only if the student performs two other contrasting pieces from standard published repertoire, within the allotted performance time.
- * No chamber music transcriptions will be allowed.
- * Entrants must not repeat repertoire from prior year's CNYAMT competitions.

Overall Competition Guidelines: Please read carefully.

- Auditions are closed to guests. Parents and teachers may listen from outside the sanctuary at Park Central Presbyterian Church.
- Accompaniment is required. Contestants must provide their own collaborative pianist.
- Contestants must provide one solo part or accompaniment part of all repertoire to the judges. Original scores are preferred, but digital printouts and xerox copies will be allowed.
- Memorization is recommended, but not required. In case of a tie, the advantage will be given to the applicant performing from memory.
- Students must reside in Onondaga, Madison, Oswego, Oneida, Cayuga, Thompson, or Cortland counties to be entered in the competition.
- All Winners commit themselves to performing on the winner's recital, Sunday, May 5, 2024, at 7:00 PM at Park Central Presbyterian Church.
- Monetary awards will be given, depending upon enrollment, up to a maximum of three places per division.
- Information about competition day details and final results will be given to teachers only, by e-mail.

- Prior intermediate division winners will be required to move up to the next division regardless of grade. Senior division winners may compete again in the senior division after a one-year break from the competition.
- Rules set forth on this page will be strictly enforced.

- We attest that the information given on this application is accurate.
- We understand that should our child win a place in the instrumental or senior scholarship competition, they have an obligation to perform at the winner's recital on May 5, 2024.
